菩提学校是由佛总于 1949 年创立的政府辅助小学，1990 年晋升为特选小学。2006 年获教育部的“学校专长活动计划奖”。

2006 年底将搬迁到麦波申的临时校舍，以进行为期两年的扩建工程。耗资 2600 万元的工程于 2009 年 6 月竣工，学校也同时迁回乌美一道上课。

学校已完成全面落实单班制的扩建工程，总经费约 1890 万元，本会承担额为 160 万元，工程已在 2015 年 11 月间动工，已在 2017 年第三季月间竣工。2018 年新学年施行单班制。增建的教学楼除了课室之外，也设有学生托管中心。

本校在 2021 年 12 月 15 日迎来第八任校长邓丽君女士。

### 1. SBF In Brief

1.1. The governing instrument of the Federation is known as the Constitution of the Singapore Buddhist Federation which has been approved by and lodged at the Office of the Commissioner of Charities and the Registrar of Societies. The current version of our Constitution was approved by the authorities on 15 October 2024.

### 1.2. Charity Registration Number

The Federation was registered as a charity on 2 April 1990 under the Charities Act. Its charity registration number is 000 727.

Maha Bodhi School is a Government-aided primary school founded by the Federation in 1949. Accorded SAP School status in 1990. Awarded “Programme for School-Based Excellence Award” in 2006.

The School was selected for PRIME\* Project with construction period from Dec 2006 to June 2009. The \$ 26M project was completed in June 2009 and the School has since then operated in this upgrade campus. A \$18.9M Upgrading Project under PERI Phase 3 was launched in 2015, SBF has to raise \$1.6m for this project. The upgrading works commenced in November 2015 and was completed in the third quarter of 2017.

With the completion of this upgrading project, Maha Bodhi School has operated as a full single Session school since January 2018. The upgraded campus has a School-based Student Care Centre.

Mdm Teng Lai Kwan had joined the School as its 8<sup>th</sup> Principal since 15 December 2021.

Manjusri Secondary School is a government-aided secondary school founded by the Federation since 1982.

The school underwent a massive \$ 27 M upgrading project under the MOE's PRIME\* initiative and relocated to Ubi Avenue 1 upon completion of project in Jan 2009. It is now adjacent to Maha Bodhi School. The School moved into this \$24M new campus since Jan 2009.

The School welcomed its 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Mr Sim Chong Boon on 15 December 2016.

(3) Prince Siddattha Child Care Centre

It is a community service division of the Federation. Founded in 1995 and located in Bukit Batok, it aims to provide quality child care and pre-school education to residents living in the vicinity of the Centre. Infant care service was added in 2024.

(4) Marine Parade Maha Bodhi Student Care Centre

It is another community service division of the Federation jointly set up with the South East CDC in 1999 to provide before and after school care service to students living around the vicinity of the Centre.
