1. 学生总数

托儿中心直至 2025 年 12 月 31 日为止，学生的名额是 99 名，其中 44 名，即 44.4%接受由幼儿培育署提供的额外学费津贴援助配套。

2. 职员总数

中心的全职职员一共有 20 位及 2 位兼职员工，这包括 1 位主任、1 位会计书记、8 位英文教师、6 位华文教师、1 位华文助理教师、2 位兼职华文助理教师、1 位厨师、及 2 位全职清洁女工。

4. 课程与举措

- 1) 今年，中心提供的托婴服务迈入第二个年头，整体报名率平均达到满额的 80%以上。
- 2) 品德教育方面，今年中心继续在每周集会教导道德歌曲，并以 Families For Life 运动的课程开展家庭价值观教育。
- 3) 今年中心提供的三项额外强化课程，即 Little Mindful Artist, Music Meadow, 及 Speech & Drama, 都由中心自聘的老师执教。其中，Music Meadow 课程开放给 N1 至 K2 的学童参加，而另外两项课程则仅开放给 N2、K1 及 K2。

5. 其他活动及庆祝会

- 中心于 1 月 24 日庆祝农历新年。当天全体师生都穿上传统新年服装与广品法师一起欢庆新年，包括舞蹈，唱游和捞鱼生等。

- 3月22日：中心举行今年第一次家长教师交流会，目的在于加强家长与教师之间的信任与了解，并促进更良好的家校合作。
- 3月28日：中心庆祝开斋节，邀请 Flair 马来老师分享开斋节的文化与习俗。当天全体师生都穿上传统马来服装，随着马来歌曲跳起马来舞蹈。
- 4月9日：中心举办艺术鉴赏活动。豆豆班及幼儿小一班的学童探索了由老师们准备的各种彩色黏土。他们使用擀面杖、饼干模具、塑料小刀、模具和小刷子等工具，制作出各种以食物为主题的作品。在这个过程中，学童不仅发挥了创意，还锻炼了手部小肌肉的发展。幼儿小二班，幼儿园一和二年级的学童则是前往 Keppel Art Centre for Education 展开一段学习之旅。他们在导览人员的带领下，参观了多个以儿童为本的学习区域。这些区域围绕着爱、关怀、关心和承诺等家庭价值观，通过艺术的方式，引导学童思考并体验这些重要的情感与品格。
- 5月4日：在新加坡佛教总会主办的卫塞节嘉年华@新加坡博览中心，K2 学童呈现一支名为《Light the Light》的歌舞表演。
- 5月8日：为了庆祝卫塞节，中心举办亲子参访活动，共有 175 名学童及其家庭成员前往光明山普觉禅寺进行寺庙导览，并参与意义深远的浴佛仪式。除了了解卫塞节的重要意义和进一步认识佛教文化外，大家也在寺庙斋堂享用由工作人员精心准备的美味素食午餐，度过了一个富有意义又温馨的上午。
- 5月30日：中心庆祝端午节，在家长志工带领下，学童亲身参与包粽子的体验活动。老师们除了讲解端午节的由来与历史背景，还特别为学童模拟龙舟比赛，让他们在欢乐的氛围中，感受到浓厚的传统与节日文化。
- 6月27日：我们带领学童前往湖畔花园进行户外学习之旅。在大自然的环境中，学童通过户外游戏进行探索与学习，培养团队合作精神和身体协调能力。几位家长志工积极参与，带领学童进行各类体能活动和游戏，为他们营造一个欢乐的学习氛围，让他们在课堂之外也能成长学习。
- 7月21日：中心庆祝种族和谐日。学童穿着不同民族的传统服装，学习各个民族的文化。他们还玩了不同的传统游戏，如踢毽子、五子棋和跳房子，并体验“林波舞”。配合 SG60 的庆祝活动，学童也创作以

“**One Nation, Many Colours**” 为主题的艺术作品。这是为了帮助学童更好地了解其他民族的习俗，培养他们之间的相互尊重。

- 5月25日：中心举行今年第二次家长教师交流会，此次会面的主要目的是与家长分享孩子在**行为、学习和发展**方面的情况。会后进行的家长问卷调查显示，家长们对本次会面的反馈非常正面和鼓舞人心，并表示他们对本中心提供的服务感到非常满意其目的是为了加强家长与老师间的相互尊重、信任与谅解。老师向家长讲解他们孩子在中心的学习发展过程与成果。我们从过后的一项家长反馈调查，获得宝贵的建议。
- 8月8日：中心庆祝国庆日。除了观看国庆阅兵和唱国庆歌曲之外，学童还根据今年的国庆主题曲《**Here We Are**》进行了一段健身表演。K1和K2的学童也绘画新加坡的标志性景点。通过《乌塔玛的故事》，学童对狮城新加坡的历史有了更深入的了解。
- 8月14日：中心请来 National Portrait 的摄影师，为各班拍摄班级照及个人照。
- 8月22日：我们带领 PG 和 N1 的学童前往 KidsSTOP。学童在互动式游戏中探索与提问，获得丰富的学习机会，这些活动旨在让他们初步接触各种科学和数学概念。
N2、K1和K2的学童则前往 Cold Storage 超市展开体验式学习之旅，旨在延伸他们的课堂学习。通过引导式的探索，学童观察不同类别的商品，讨论健康的食物选择，并在逛超市的过程中实际运用金钱概念和沟通技巧。
- 9月4日：中心庆祝教师节。为了表达对教师和员工的感激之情，家长和孩子们在爱心形状的卡片上写下祝福，这些留言随后被展示在三棵大型的“感恩树”上。一些家长还为老师们准备了特别的午餐及点心。学童也为老师制作了手工艺品、饼干和小礼物。
- 9月20日：中心举行今年第二次家长教师交流会，此次会面的主要目的是与家长分享孩子在**行为、学习和发展**方面的情况。会后进行的家长问卷调查显示，家长们对本次会面的反馈非常正面和鼓舞人心，并表示他们对本中心提供的服务感到非常满意
- 9月26日：中心庆祝中秋节，学童参与剥柚子比赛和猜灯谜游戏。老师给学童说了中秋节的传说，并让他们品尝各种不同类型的月饼，也带领他们到邻里提灯笼，感受浓浓的节日气氛。

- 10月5日：为庆祝儿童节，中心带学童到滨海湾花园的儿童公园玩水。
- 10月25日：中心于下午3点30分至5点在Chevrans礼堂举办了年度K2毕业典礼。中心的所有N2、K1和K2的孩子们表演了名为《槃特兄弟之扫心地》的音乐剧。K2的毕业生们还通过茶礼向父母表达了感激之情。
- 10月17日：中心举行屠妖节庆祝会。老师们为孩子们播放一段介绍“光明节”意义的视频，并示范印度手绘（Henna）。其中一位老师也示范印度煎饼（Roti Prata）的制作过程，作为庆祝活动的一部分。午餐时，孩子们享用咖喱饭，并品尝印族小吃如putu mayam及murrukku等。
- 12月22日：中心举行冬至、圣诞及新年庆祝会。老师们解释这些节日的意义，全体师生随后参与各种游戏及歌唱节目，载歌载舞，其乐融融。

6. 财政

- 中心在新金融发展有限公司存放的\$300,000定期存款于2025年2月24日到期，取出金额S\$304,509.86。随后，该笔款项先后两次续存为期三个月的定期存款，以及一次续存为期六个月的定期存款，相应的利率分别为2.6%、2%和1.55%。该笔\$308,028.76的定期存款将于2026年2月26日到期。
- 另一笔存放于新金融发展有限公司的\$300,000定期存款已于2025年8月24日到期，本金连同利息合计\$309,000。该笔款项随后续存为期六个月的定期存款，利率为1.55%，并将于2026年2月23日到期。
- 中心收到善款共计S\$116,985.00。
- 中心总收入为S\$1,162,650.06（包括以上善款），总开销S\$1,159,658.71，净年亏损为S\$28,870.17。

1. Enrolment

As at 31 December 2025, the centre had a total capacity of 99 children. 44 of them, or 44.4% were receiving additional subsidy given by MSF.

2. Staff Strength

Our centre had a team of 20 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff, consisting of 1 Supervisor, 1 full-time Centre Administrator, 8 English Language Teachers, 6 Chinese Language Teachers, 1 Chinese Language Assistant Teacher, 2 Part-Time Chinese Language Assistant Teacher, 1 Cook, and 2 full-time Cleaners.

4. Various Programs

- This year marked the second year of the centre providing infant care services, with enrolment reaching an average of above 80% of full capacity.
- For our Character Education curriculum, we continued to introduce moral songs during weekly assembly and carried out family values education using the Families for Life (FFL) movement packages.
- This year, we engaged our own trainers for all three optional enrichment programs, namely Little Mindful Artist, Music Meadow and Speech & Drama. While Music Meadow is offered to children from N1 to K2 levels, the other two programs are offered only to N2, K1 and K2 children.

5. Events and Celebrations

- On 24 January, we celebrated Lunar New Year with Venerable Seck Kwang Phing joining us. The children and teachers dressed in traditional costumes or party clothes and participated in various activities significant to the occasion.

They learned about Chinese culture and the importance of Chinese New Year, followed by performances from PG to K2. Venerable Seck Kwang Phing gave his blessings to the children and distributed mandarin oranges to the representatives of each class. The Yu-Sheng tossing ceremony was led by Venerable, with all the children gathering around to observe the process.

- On 22 March, the centre organized our 1st Parent-Teacher-Meeting session. The objectives of this session are to strengthen trust and understanding between parents and teachers, and for better home-school collaboration.
- On 28 March, the centre celebrated Hari Raya Puasa to help children gain a deeper understanding of Muslim culture. We invited our Flair teacher, Teacher Siti, to share how Hari Raya is celebrated in a Muslim family, including common eating practices observed by our Muslim friends. She also introduced the different types of traditional Malay costumes and explained how they are worn. The celebration ended on a lively note as the children danced to various traditional Malay songs, enjoying the festive spirit together.
- On 9 April, we celebrated Art Appreciation Day with engaging and creative activities across all levels. PG and N1 children explored various types of dough prepared by the teachers. Using tools such as rolling pins, cookie cutters, plastic knives, molds, and small brushes, they created a variety of food-themed items. This hands-on activity allowed them to express their creativity while developing fine motor skills. Meanwhile, N2, K1, and K2 children went on a learning journey to the Keppel Centre for Art Education. They participated in a guided tour of several child-friendly learning zones. The exhibits and activities focused on the family values of Love, Care, Concern, and Commitment, encouraging the children to reflect on these important themes through art.
- Our K2 children performed a dance titled 'Light the Light' at the Vesak Carnival @Singapore Expo, organised by Singapore Buddhist Federation on 4 May 2025.
- On 8 May, in celebration of Vesak Day, we organized a family excursion to Kong Meng San Phor Kark See Monastery. A total of 175 children and their family members participated in a guided temple tour and took part in the symbolic bathing of Buddha ceremony. In addition to learning about the significance of Vesak Day and gaining a deeper understanding of Buddhism, everyone also enjoyed a delicious vegetarian lunch specially prepared by the temple staff at the temple canteen.
- On 30 May, the centre celebrated the Dumpling Festival (Dragon Boat Festival). The children learned about the history of the festival and how it is celebrated in modern times. They participated in a fun and hands-on

dumpling-wrapping activity, guided by our wonderful parent volunteers. To add to the excitement, the teachers also simulated a dragon boat race, giving the children a lively and memorable cultural experience.

- On 27 June, the children embarked on an enriching excursion to Lakeside Gardens, where they engaged in experiential learning through outdoor play. The natural environment provided opportunities for exploration, teamwork, and physical activity. Parent volunteers played an active role in leading and facilitating various physical exercises and games, helping to create a fun and supportive atmosphere for the children to learn and grow beyond the classroom.
- On 21 July, we celebrated Racial Harmony Day. The children wore different ethnic costumes and learned about the cultures of various ethnic groups. They also had fun playing traditional games and trying the 'Limbo Dance'. In line with the SG60 celebration, the children created an artwork themed 'One Nation, Many Colours'. This event aimed to help the children develop a better understanding of other races and foster mutual respect among all.
- We held our National Day celebration on 8 August. In addition to watching the National Day Parade and singing National Day songs, our children performed a workout to this year's National Day song, "**Here We Are.**" The K1 and K2 children also created drawings of Singapore's iconic places. Through *The Story of Utama*, the children gained a deeper understanding of the history of **Singapura**, the Lion City.
- On 14 August, we held our annual photo-taking session from 9am to 12.30pm. The classes took turns to have their photographs taken by photographers from National Portrait.
- On 22 August, we brought the PG and N1 children to KidsSTOP. The children were given ample opportunities to learn through interactive play designed to introduce various science and numeracy concepts. They were encouraged to explore, inquire, investigate, and innovate through a range of hands-on activities.
The N2, K1 and K2 children also participated in an experiential learning journey to Cold Storage Supermarket, designed to extend their classroom learning. Through guided exploration, the children observed different product categories, discussed healthy food choices, and applied real-world money sense and communication skills while navigating the supermarket environment.
- On 4 September, we celebrated Teachers' Day. To show their appreciation for the teachers and staff, parents and children wrote messages on heart-shaped cutouts. These messages were then displayed on three large

“appreciation trees.” Some parents arranged special treats for the teachers, and the children also made crafts, cookies, and small gifts for them.

- On 20 September, the centre organized our 2nd Parent-Teacher-Meeting session. The main objective of this session is to share information on the child’s behaviour, learning and development. Post PTM survey shows that feedback given by the parents on the session was very positive and encouraging, and suggested that they were very satisfied with our services.
- On 26 September, we celebrated Mid-Autumn Festival. The children participated in a pomelo-peeling competition and a riddle-guessing game. They learned about the legend of the Mid-Autumn Festival and tasted different types of mooncakes. We also brought the children around the neighborhood to carry lanterns and enjoy the festive atmosphere.
- In celebrating Children’s Day, we brought the children to Children’s Garden, Gardens By The Bay to have water play on 5 October.
- On 17 October, the centre celebrated Deepavali. Teachers showed a video explaining the significance of the Festival of Lights and conducted a demonstration of henna drawing. One of the teachers also demonstrated the preparation of roti prata as part of the celebration. The children enjoyed curry rice for lunch and sampled Indian snacks such as putu mayam and murukku.
- On 25 October, the centre held its annual K2 Graduation Ceremony at the Auditorium@Chevrons from 3.30pm to 5pm. All the N2, K1 and K2 children from the centre participated in a musical skit titled <Two Brothers. One Dharma>. The K2 graduates also expressed their gratitude to their parents through a traditional tea ceremony.
- On 22 December, the centre celebrated Winter Solstice, Christmas and New Year. In addition to learning about the significance of these festivals, the children also participated in various games and a sing-along session.

6. Finance

- A fixed deposit of \$300,000 in Sing Investments & Finance Limited matured on 24 February 2025 with a sum of \$304,509.86. This was subsequently renewed twice for three months each time and then once for six months, at interest rates of 2.6%, 2% and 1.55% respectively. The amount of \$308,028.76 will mature on 26 February 2026.
- Another fixed deposit of \$300,000 in Sing Investments & Finance Limited matured on 24 August 2025 with a sum of \$309,000. This amount was renewed for another six months at an interest rate of 1.55%. It will mature on 23 February 2026.

- We received cash donations amounting to a total sum of S\$116,985.00.
- With our total income (including the donations) amounting to S\$1,162,650.06 and total expenses S\$1,191,520.23, **the deficit for the year was S\$28,870.17.**
